New curriculum based around the Literacy Tree- this is a Trust wide approach.

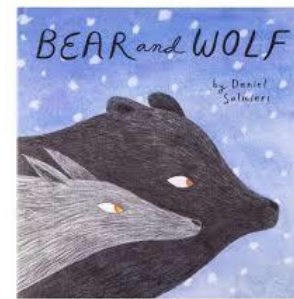

Supporting your child with their reading

- Make it a part of a routine
- Encourage your child to sound it out- but if they struggle then tell them what the word is
- Books should be easy as children are reading for fluency at their level
- Take time to ask them questions, make predictions, tell you what they think
- Your child will also have red words (common exception words to learn) along with phonics strips to support them with their learning

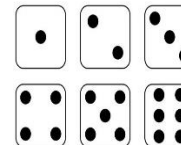

Maths- Subitising is a term that was coined by the theorist Piaget and defined the ability to instantaneously recognise the number of objects in a small group without the need to count them. Start with two dice and roll them and get the children to find the totals. Then move onto three. As a challenge write down the number sentences.
