- The Reception team will be sending out weekly email updates (in addition to the whole school newsletter) with links and notices -please look out for it on a Friday afternoon.











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

A love of books and reading...



• We use The Literacy Tree scheme to plan for our Literacy lessons. It uses quality texts that give opportunity to create 'awe and wonder' through the teaching and planning for continuous provision, using props, puppets and small world activities.

We read to the children every day – this is something that continues across the school in each year group.

Phonics



- In Reception, our phonics lessons follow Read Write Inc. Your child will learn to:
 - Say the sound that is represented by each letter or groups of letters. These are called 'speed sounds'.



- How to blend the sounds together in a word to read it. This is called 'soundblending' eg. c-a-t, *cat*.
- We will be holding a phonics workshop next week where we will be able to answer any questions you may have.
- We will be sending home sound sheets for the children to complete after they have learnt each sound.





Top Tips and Reminders



Uniform, Shoes and Raincoat

Please label everything! Children will need a raincoat and a pair of labelled indoor shoes/slippers and outdoor shoes in school each day. We have provided plastic boxes with names on to keep items safe from the visiting foxes. During the Autumn term we will be accessing our forest school area and children will also need a pair of wellington boots. A separate letter will be shared about woodland sessions which will begin after the half term.

Spares

Please provide a small bag of 'spares' to leave on your child's peg. These do not have to be school uniform, but something we can change your child into if they have an accident or get wet/muddy etc. Aprons will we used for water play and creative activities.

Healthy Snacks and water bottle

The school provides a healthy snack (fruit and vegetables) and milk in the morning and afternoon each day. There is no need to provide an additional snack unless your child is attending an after- school club. Please remember we are a nut free school. Please provide your child with a labelled water bottle.

Absenteeism/Appointments

Please ensure that all doctor's appointments, dentist appointments are made outside of school time.

<u>Birthdays</u>

As we are a healthy school, fruit can be brought in if you wish. Children can also bring in a book to donate to their class reading corner on their birthday.

Reading expectations

We ask you to try and read each evening. We will be sending home a reading record for you to 'record' your reads. It is still really important for you to read stories to children in addition to the 'reading books' that are sent home so they have a chance to 'listen' to stories being read to them. Initially the books will be wordless before moving onto RWI blending books and then levelled books which correspond to their phonics group. Please also make use of our self service library on our EYFS balcony.

Super Pets!

Each class has a super pet teddy. Each child will have an opportunity to take home their class super pet and add a page to the class the diary which is shared in school with their peers

WOW! Moments

We love to celebrate our wonderful children and all they achieve at home and school. If they do something at home that you think deserves a WOW! moment, please fill out the slip an bring it into school to share with their class.










'All About Me' Activity

As part of the children's transition topic, we would like everyone to complete an 'All about Me activity'. This is a 'collage' all about your child. It's Good to be Green!





We have high expectations of children's behaviour. Our school ethos is to notice good behaviour and give attention to children making 'green choices'.

Children are given yellow/red cards for not making a good choice. Children are supported to 'turn their behaviour around and make a good choice'.

We reward effort and attitude, kindness and following our class/school rules during lessons, playtime, at lunch and on trips. Children have helped to create their class rules and 'sign it' with their handprint.

We give out green tokens and collectively work towards filling our class jar, promoting the value of teamwork and working towards a shared goal.

Once our jar is filled, we celebrate as a class.
